COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSION

- Participating teams in the playoff will be admitted by roster. Only players, coaches and managers directly
 involved in the game are to be included on the roster. Rosters must be uploaded onto the WPA website BY
 Wednesday, May 1st. Rosters are limited to 22 players and 6 personnel and 1 licensed health care
 provider/trainer. Your roster will serve as your pass list.
- Superintendents, building administrators, athletic directors and/or supervisory personnel from each school will be admitted when they present a valid NW District 1 **PURPLE** colored "**EVENT**" Supervisory pass.
- Additional accepted passes: State Coaches & Athletic Directors' Association passes, WOA State Observer passes, NW District 1 and WIAA Lifetime passes.

FINANCES

All financial arrangements will be in accordance with NW District 1 financial policies for district tournaments.

UNIFORMS

The home team will wear uniforms dark in color and is the higher seeded team on the bracket. The visiting team will wear white uniform. Teams are responsible to bring both jerseys in case there is a conflict.

LOCKER ROOMS

Locker rooms will be provided. **Do not** leave valuables in the locker room. If two or more games are played on the same night at the same site, teams will have use of the locker room through half time of their game. The teams for the following game will be able to use locker room after half time of the preceding game.

WARM-UP


The field will be open for warm-up 60 minutes prior to game time. If a double-header, a minimum of 15 minutes will be provided for warm-up before Game #2 will begin.

PRE-MATCH CEREMONY:

0 minutes Left on the Clock (approximately 6 minutes before kick-off)

The referee is to meet with the captains and linespersons to make equipment inspection. Officials will stand in the center of the field on the 50 yard line.

Teams are to line up on the west football out-of-bounds line between the 30- and 40-yard lines facing the center of the field. The visiting team is to line up on the south half of the field and the home team on the north half. See diagram



GRANDSTAND

The announcer will introduce the roster players of the visiting team. As each member is introduced, they shall run out to the hashmarks and line up next to officials. The coaches will then be introduced. The team is to stay in position.

The announcer will introduce the roster players of the home team in the same manner as the visitors followed by the coaches. The officials will be introduced and as each person is announced, he/she will take one step forward and remain in place.

National Anthem will be played. If more than one game, National Anthem will be played prior to both games.

SEATING

- No spectators will be permitted inside the playing area.
- •When at tournament location at Shoreline Stadium, Home school will sit in the NORTH half of the grandstands & Visiting school will sit in the SOUTH half.

SOCCER BALLS

The match soccer balls (3) will be the responsibility of the designated home team. Each school will furnish its own warm-up balls.

TIE GAMES – DISTRICT & STATE TOURNAMENT

In all District & State playoff games, the method of breaking ties will be as follows: If a tie exists at the expiration of a regulation game, no more than two 5-minute sudden death overtime periods will be played. If a tie still exists, each team shall take five penalty kicks. Team A will take one penalty kick, then Team B, then Team A, etc., until each team has taken five penalty kicks. The kicks shall be taken alternately. If after each team has taken five penalty kicks and the score is still tied, the taking of penalty kicks shall continue until such time as each team has taken the same number of kicks and one team has scored one goal more that the other. The kicks shall not continue after a team has scored enough goals to win.

Roster Limitations:

District 1 will follow the WIAA SOPs for team and bench roster size. Per the WIAA SOPs, the roster limitations include: 22 players, 6 designated team/school personnel (Coaches, managers, statisticians), and 1 medical staff.

GAME AND STADIUM REGULATIONS

Signs and Confetti, Decorations and Noisemakers

- Tournament sponsors, broadcast media coverage, official school banners and hand-held signs that are positive and directed only toward your school's team are permitted. Run-through signs are not permitted.
- Throwing objects or the scattering of paper in the stands, on the fields, and the general stadium and school area is prohibited. A school violating this policy may be assessed a fine for the cost of cleanup.
- Power air horns and other artificial noisemakers are strictly prohibited. Such devices will be impounded and will be returned, upon request, to the owner after the game. Band instruments are not to be used as noisemakers.

Announcements

- All announcements made over the public address system or the megaphones used by cheerleaders or other school personnel must refer directly to the program in progress. No other announcement will be permitted unless first cleared by the Game Manager.

Concessions and Programs

- The programs and concessions are the responsibility of the host site.

YOUTH SUPPORT OF TEAM

District 1 will be following the below WIAA guidance related to youth support at contests.

The WIAA will not allow any students younger than high school age to participate in supporting roles at a WIAA State Championship unless the parent/guardian signs a waiver ahead of time and acknowledges they assume all risk. The WIAA's catastrophic insurance does not cover these younger students so they assume all risk related to injury. Such roles to include student trainers, student managers, student coaches, student scorekeepers, student bat and ball boys/girls, student water boys/girls, etc.

Note: A school cannot sign a WIAA waiver on behalf of an individual - all WIAA waivers MUST be signed by the parent/guardian of the minor.

A copy of the waiver must be provided to the tournament manager PRIOR to any games where this applies. In addition, schools need to keep a copy of the waiver with them at all times during the event.

SHORELINE STADIUM FIELD GUIDELINES

The following items are **prohibited** on the field and track:

FOOD (sunflower seeds, peanuts, popcorn)

GUM & CANDY

GLASS CONTAINERS

FLAVORED DRINKS (Water only)

Each team is responsible for picking up their trash and equipment (tape, cups and litter). Please do your part to keep our field looking clean.

DIRECTIONS TO SHORELINE STADIUM:

Southbound I-5

Take Exit #177 from I-5
Drive right on 205th Street (Head West)
Turn Left on 1st Avenue NE (first light)
Parking lot is on your left just before
NE 185th Street

Northbound I-5

Take Exit #175 from I-5 (175th St.)
Drive left on 175th (Head West)
Drive Right on Meridian (Head North)
Drive Right onto 185th (Head East)
Parking lot is on your left, just after
1st Avenue NE.
